



The Ancient World

- The very first civilization was created by the Sumerians
- Settled in cities, cultivated plants and livestock in Mesopotamia
- Different writing forms were created in Egypt, India, China and many more countries
- Egypt created pyramids and statues
- S. Asia shared crossing parts with India,
 Pakistan and Afghanistan
- Large cities sheltered large populations,
 produced artifacts and fertile land due
 to its nearby river



- **★** Typhoid fever caused ¾ of the population to die
- ★ Symptoms: fever, thirst, bloody throat and tongue, red skin and lesions
- ★ Spartans defeat Athenians by the weakening disease

The Medieval World

- 1206 Ghengis Khan ruled the Mongols from Central Asia
- Defeated China, India, The Middle East, and Russia
- Assimilated to the cultures of the defeated countries
- Allowed them to continue their religious beliefs and customs
- Trade ideas and technology along with
 Song Dynasty
- 1024 introduced paper currency, developed new methods of rice farming that doubled output
- China infrastructure improved due to waterways

- **★** The Bubonic plague (Black Death): started in Asia in 1350
- **★** 1347 entered Sicily in a ship sailed in the port of Messina
- ★ Death spread through Europe quickly
- ★ Forced a truce to the England and France
 War
- ★ Drastic change to the demographics and economy cause a collapse in the BrtitishFeudal System
- ★ Vikings lost their strenght
- **★** Halt to the North America exploration

World Of Empires

- China was one of the dominant empires around which later were weakened by the Opium War while fighting the British Empire
- The British Empire expanded vastly through India and other places after the Revolutionary War
- Europeans traveled all through Africa and pacific Islands

- ★ The First Cholera Pandemic struck in 1817 infecting the small intestine
- ★ One million people died in its country of origin, Russia
- ★ Food and water were infected by feces
- ★ The bacteria affected British soldiers traveling to India causing more deaths
- ★ Cholera was spread to Spain, Africa, Indonesia, China, Japan, Italy, Germany and America killing 150,000 more
- ★ 1885 vaccine did nothing to diminish the pandemic

The Modern World

- European powers wanted to maintain power throughout Europe
- Military and political Alliances were formed in the 1900
- Germany delcared war causing
 Austria-Hungary to fight Serbia
- Germany was responsible to pay for the damages caused by the war
- Other nations became powerful while
 Europe was in debt

- ★ The Spanish Flu began in 1918 due to an outbreak in Madrid
- **★** Europe, The United States and Asia were affected
- ★ 50 million died
- ★ No vaccine/ drug was effective to combat the Spanish flu

Africa

- Cold War left super powers in constant battle to gain power
- Climate change, severe famine and instability allowed for the lack of long term solutions to better the region
- White owned businesses dwindled, taking matter into their own hands
- Apartheid: legalized discimination against the country's nonwhite population
- Non whites were stripped off their political rights and freedom
- Nelson Mandela hosted a nonviolent demonstration to advocate for the African people; leading to his imprisonment

- ★ Aids was first recognized in 1981
- ★ It's said to destroy a person's immune system
- HIV infected persons feel effects like fever, headache and enlarged lymph nodes
- ★ Carriers are highly infectious by blood and genital fluid destroying the persons t-cells leading to death
- **★** Introduced by American gay communities
- ★ Truly began as a virus in Chimpanzees in West Africa during the 1920's
- ★ Between 1960 and 1970 it traveled to Haiti, New York and San Francisco
- ★ A vaccine is taken to treat the disease but not to cure it

New Challenges In The 21st Century

- Communism and the Cold War have collapsed
- The Green Revolution has begun to enhance crops and eradicate hunger due to the lack of food and growing population
- Genetic Modification altered plants genetic material to resist pests and diseases
- Scientists began to conduct more succeses in heart transplants
- Human activity has increased global warming
- Animals are closer to extinction and plants to deforestation

- Severe Acute Respiratory Syndromes have risen causing a new strain of the Coronavirus making it the deadliest one
- ★ It's said that it began in bats later infecting cats and then humans in China
- A dry cough persists to fever, head and body aches, sneezes and death due to the lack of oxyygen, pneumonia and the virus attacking multiple organs causing them to shut down
 - 163 countries were affected and over thousands of people have died In order to contain the virus, the government demanded to quarantine everyone in efforts to lessen the contamination

Conclusion

- Most of the pandemics presented in the previous slides caused terror and panic
- Fighting the diseases was impossible due to the lack of medicine

- Even today with advanced technology and medicine in the medical industry, it has become tough to find cures to the deadliest diseases
