WWII 1939-1945



WWII started when Hitler's Germany decided to invade Poland. What followed next was nothing short of tragic. According to my sources, between 35-60 million people lost their lives. The group that suffered the greatest loss was the USSR. They had over 4 million soldiers either killed, wounded, or captured, which was the most of any country involved in the war. This was known as the "War of Lightning - Blitzkrieg". It was given this name because of the new strategies that were being used. In this type of warfare, the attacker would deliver quick, decisive blows to their enemy before they had a chance to mobilize. This led to quick victories and also less loss of soldiers on the attacker's side.

The U.S. wanted to get to space before the USSR did so they were competing for the knowledge of the one man that they thought knew how to get them to space. A German scientist named Wernher Von Braun created a V2 rocket which was what they both thought that they needed to get to space. Any side that got to space first would be able to put out propaganda showing that they are doing better than the other. The USSR won that race by putting the first artificial satellite in space, shortly after the U.S. followed by putting their own satellite in space.
